Non-EEA students (non-European Economic Area students) Explanation of the costs

A) Tuition fees for non-EEA students	<p>Tuition fees for the period 1 September 2018 – 31 August 2019 have been set at € 12.943 for all non-EEA (European Economic Area) students. The exact tuition fee for the academic year 2019/2020 is not determined yet.</p> <p>Due to Dutch governmental policies, Hotelschool The Hague (and all other professional universities) are not funded by the Dutch government for the education of non-EEA students. Non-EEA students therefore pay higher tuition fees than EEA students.</p>
B) Summer course fees	<p>The fee for the summer course is including meals.</p>
D) Visa costs	<p>The visa costs (€ 321)** include a residence permit for 4 years and, if applicable, a provisional residence permit to enter The Netherlands.</p> <p>In the first week of arrival at the beginning of the academic year students will be informed about how to obtain the residence permit, open a bank account, register at the City Hall and all other important matters related to becoming an official resident.</p>
E) Refund (living costs)	<p>In order to receive a visa, non-EEA students in The Netherlands are required to have a minimum of approximately € 875 per month to cover their living costs (board and lodgings). This means that a minimum of €10.500 is required for the first year. This amount is excluding tuition fees.</p> <p>So the following costs are paid from the sum of € 10.500:</p> <p>€ 10.500 <u>€ 321 Visa costs</u> € 10.179 refund</p> <p>The remaining sum of € 10.179 will be refunded after your start.</p>
Total costs	<p>Non-EEA students accepted for Hotelschool The Hague, academic year 2018-2019, are obligated to pay forthwith the total amount of € 13.400 to Hotelschool The Hague.</p> <p>After this amount has been received, Hotelschool The Hague will start the visa procedure immediately and send your application to the Immigration- and Naturalisation department (IND).</p> <p>Please click on the following links for more info about studying in The Netherlands: www.studyinholland.nl/practical-matters/visas-and-permits</p>

Computer/laptop	<p>Although the school provides excellent computer facilities, we do advise students to purchase a laptop. Each student can log on to the school computer network by using their personal username & password as assigned by the IT Department.</p> <p>Throughout the school and at the Skotel rooms there are also wireless access points where you can connect to the Internet via your own laptop, mobile phone etc. using the 'HDH-HotSpot'. Please make sure you have a suitable portable device and either using a normal network cable (utp patch cable) or WiFi.</p>
Books	<p>Books can be bought from the school's supplier. Other lesson materials consist mainly of a course guide that contains important information for each course, such as the number of EC's it provides, who the lecturers are, etc. Workbooks and manuals provide additional reading material to supplement the books. Student expenditure for practicals	<p>These average costs include uniforms and amount to approximately € 490** (excluding the optional kitchen shoes, socks and belt).</p>
